 - Check "Lingo": Switch Up to more common language.
 - Amplify access to severe weather shelters.
 - Idea: add a video, in different languages, to provide a short overview
 - Inform about navigation/systems vs. exhaustive list of providers, but the way to access.
 - "I'm looking for..." headings
 - Accessible language for public, and public in urgent/crisis, trauma. Trauma informed approach to language.

Discussion:

- Informatica software is important to translate data from any number of organizations to manage any type of data source in any format. Meet organizations where they are at with their data curation.
- Shared leadership and ownership for collective good.
- Person centered care aspect. idea that we are not just collecting data resources, but to gather information about the individual users to minimize transfer of information and to increase coordinated care.
- There are programs like Julato that do that 'care coordination' function. It would be cool to map how a tool like Julato would overlay with a CIE and 2-1-1.
- Tool for data collection for advocacy for policy change. More real time impact on looking at and understanding data.

 - Gen Forward received a variety of ideas to parent council. There has been an exchange between parent council and Gen Frwd group. Enhance the services of Community Resource Center. Awaiting details on what that means, looks like. Tell us more. Next steps to receive feedback.
 - If we can nail down whether we are using the 211 taxonomy how are we paying for it, etc. then we can start creating our own database.
 - We need to get commitment from the local agencies to be willing to submit their info into our database and provide them with an interface to do that. Then we can start working on a front-facing website interface for clients/people/agencies to search the database.
 - Two active GF Policy/Advocacy Policy Workgroup and the Family Council. Still participating in the DSHS group. Through the state. Recipient to GF.
