- Activity Debrief, What We Learned:
 - My situation toggles and comparisons between organizations: helpful
 - Searchable and updated—not stagnant, printed
 - Taxonomy is important
 - Database should be adaptive and shared
 - Build common local language "shared language" would be part of training curricula
 - Find out if 211 has a shared taxonomy across nation, or if it is state/regionally shared
 - 211 has a negative connotation in Whatcom County: trust issues, would need to rebuild partnership, outreach campaign
 - o Partnerships with County Library System and 211 may be happening

- We need an open, collaborative partnership with whoever is the repository/technical entity and the community curators and lead curator.
- A Community Vision of Lead Partnerships: WCLS; WCGov; OC as lead curator;
 Community Curators aligned with Social determinants of health.
