Lifeline Connections

- Behavioral health agency in Bellingham, for all of Whatcom.
- Outpatient mental health program just cleared waitlist, open for enrollment, and affering an additional prescriber.
- Anyone seeking affordable mental health services, call Lifeline.
- A few services for adolescents, usually provided through juvenile court system.
- Also have SUD services, IOP, OP, and access to Inpatient.
- PACT team: serves people with serious mental illness: someone who's tried other servies, but nothing's working.
- Offers peer support, counseling, prescribing, medication support, case management, and access to other services like employmen and education.
- Lifeline can take multiple sources of insurance, not just Medicaid.
- Housing program can help people find housing, but Lifeline does not have housing.

- Local health insurance broker, services for people under and over 65
- Can walk through process with anyone who is dual eligible for Medicaid
- Services are available at no cost

Bellingham Food Bank

- Client survey found there are 28 different languages represented among BFB clients
- If anyone has access to diverse groups of people, looking to make connections, help bringing outreach to more groups.
- Also looking for help with language support and communications including Mixteco, Arabic, Ukraininan, Russian, Punjabi, and others. Can easily make materials and content available in different languages, but it's more important to actually connect with the people who speak those languages

Northwest Youth Services

- Josh, new Director of Adolescent Services at NWYS, primary point of contact for PAD program, teen support
- Emergency shelter previously located on State St. moved to Ridgemont neighborhood:
 - shelter for youth ages 13 -17, mainly short-term, plus 2 long-term beds.
 - Teens can call and screen, or can be referred.
 - Additional services provided during stay, including school enrollment, connection to resources, etc.

- Teen Court restorative justice program: works with young people charged with a criminal act, provides help to navigate away from the traditional legal system into a restorative justice approach.
 - High school volunteers take on all roles: judge, jury, etc.
 - o 6 different high schools across Whatcom participate.
 - Really special program with a goal to provide holistic services to young people to prevent repeat offenses, and get support they need.
 - First TC night: October 11th second Wednesday of the month.
 - Anyone can come and observe

Unity Care NW

- Insurance navigators can help with Medicaid enrollment, Medicare, qualified helath plans, and Medicare Savings Program.
- Important: with pandemic ending, Medicaid redeterminations effecting people under and over 65 if they are on Medicaid.
 - A lot of people over 65 losing Medicaid and don't understand why.
- Don't have to be a patient at UCNW to get help from an insurance navigator

Seattle Block Project in Whatcom County

- Working to bring a variation of the Seattle Block Project to Whatcom.
- Build microhomes with net positive energy, plugged into a main house as an ADU
- Microhomes produce more energy than they use, so main house gets benefit.
- \$75,000 cost, \$150,000 value when sold. Profit put into next ADU for next homeowner wanting to participate.
- Very accessible for volunteers without construction experience
- Folks that move in are formerly homeless, independent, case managed at least 6
 months prior, and go through a background check process.
- Seattle model is not currently charging rent, but looking into setting a 30% of income rent rate.
- Von is working on bringing together people to make it happen in our community. If you're interested in getting involved, or if you have a home and want to host someone, reach out.
