DISABILITY RESOURCES

According to the CDC, a disability is any condition of the body or mind that makes it more difficult for a person to perform certain activities and interact with the world around them. An estimated 20.3 million families, or 29% of all families in the US have at least one member with a disability. These families often experience increased financial costs and physical and emotional demands, but having a strong community and access to resources can help to provide a much needed safety net. Whatcom County has many services dedicated to helping people with disabilities thrive. While we cannot name them all here, we would like to highlight a few local/state agencies and resource databases:

<u>The Arc of Whatcom</u>: a local agency with a mission to improve the quality of life, increase the independence and assure the full inclusion in the community of all persons with developmental disabilities. Resource directory <u>here</u>.

<u>Disability Voter Guide:</u> a guide on who can vote, how, when, and where to vote, and more for people with disabilities.

<u>DVR</u>: a statewide resource assisting people with disabilities to prepare for, secure, maintain, advance in, or regain employment. Learn more <u>here</u>.

<u>Max Higbee Center:</u> community-based recreation programs for youth and adults with developmental disabilities
