#### Bellingham Public Library - Jenni Johnson

- New staff position at the library that is dedicated to addressing civic engagement, homelessness, and substance use in the libraries via outreach and engagement.
- Behavioral Health Specialist staff are on site during open hours moving through the library meeting and engaging with anyone in need of assistance, and supporting staff. This is a new program and a learning process.

#### Whatcom Community College - Dawn

- Now holding ELL classes for newly arrived immigrants
- High school completion program: An online, accelerated program that helps students complete the required remaining classes for a Washington State High School Diploma. Credits can be earned for life and work experience. No Washington State residency requirement, but students must have a WA address.
- To be eligible, students must be at least 18 years old and their graduation year must have passed.

#### A Way Home WA - Dan

- Statewide organization. Produces data to advocate for driving down youth homelessness.
- Youth Action Board: Youth with lived experience with homelessness. Involved in street outreach in collaboration with Northwest Youth Services. Always looking for additional young people interested in participating - it's a great way for those with opinions and direct experience to get paid for helping to make change.
- Working to streamline system for first contact designed to be accessible to young people entering supportive housing for the first time.

#### Opportunity Council EcSA - Kevi

- Financial empowerment and coaching program for households looking to improve financial stability and employment opportunities.
- Families are paired with mentors, and connected to job search services and financial literacy programming. Incentives are awarded for completed goals.
   \$2700 worth of incentives are available for completing goals, and up to \$3000 additional for beginning employment.
- Always looking for more mentors. No experience is necessary. ~5 hour/month time commitment with upfront training provided.

#### Allied Arts of Whatcom County - Kelly

- Partnering with organizations to emphasize the culture and art of traditionally underserved communities. Hired a cultural outreach coordinator staff position.

#### Law Advocates - Isabelle

- Civil and legal aid service for people at or below 200% of the federal poverty line.
- Street law at the library: registration required, 20 minute consult with an attorney.
   Includes tenant, family and general law
- Will program: free sample will for people above the age of 60 or living with a terminal illness.
- Debt clinic with NW Justice Project at the courthouse some Fridays, check ahead to confirm.
