Unite Us

- Updates from Kristi's meeting with Unite Us
 - Launching free service in Whatcom 6/2: any non-profit that wants to can join network
 - Focused on care management
 - Have to join network, and convince other partners to join in order to participate in database
 - They have invited us to participate in our own strategy session, and have asked to be present at future TPC meetings
- Input from group:
 - Unite Us is coming to our community, so need to be included in our conversation
 - Concerns that Unite Us platform will end up complicating referrals, but could potentially be a helpful tool
 - Would like to learn more about how the platform includes the individual seeking services in the communication - e.g. do they have visibility into the "closed loop." It feels important that they do.
 - Open to Roosevelt joining our meetings, but as a listener, not as a participant, as his interests are biased
 - Wait to include in our conversation until after we've seen a demo. Table it for now
